General Description

Performs generalized corrections work in the care, custody, control and re-entry of sentenced and non-sentenced inmates at the John E. Polk Correctional Facility.

A Detention Deputy is a uniformed officer who is responsible for the care, custody, control and re-entry of sentenced and non-sentenced inmates. As a detention deputy, your role includes helping provide offenders with the tools necessary to become law abiding citizens upon release. Detention Deputies maintain a consistent routine and demeanor while supervising offenders.

Typical Duties

Ensuring the safety and security of inmates

Supervising inmates to prevent altercations

Maintaining accurate count and current location of all inmates

Communicate effectively and coherently with other officers and inmates

Demonstrate communications skills in court and other formal settings

Ensure the cleanliness of the area of assigned responsibility

Perform crisis intervention functions to include counseling, suicide prevention, recognizing abnormal behavior, and taking appropriate action

DUAL CERTIFIED

Detention Deputies that are sworn in as
Dual Certified will be required to facilitate
any necessary arrests or detainment of
individuals within the scope of their job or
specialized position. May be required to
investigate crimes committed within a
Seminole County Sheriff's Office Facility.
This includes the John E. Polk correctional
facility, Courthouses, Juvenile Facilities
and Seminole County Probation facilities.
If being utilized on a specialized
enforcement team than the Dual Certified
Detention Deputy may make lawful arrests

and or detentions during the operational need only.

Minimum Qualifications

- High School Diploma or GED
- A citizen of the United States
- 21 years of age
- Certified or certifiable in the State of Florida
- Must not have been convicted of any felony or of a misdemeanor involving perjury or false statement, nor have received a dishonorable discharge from any of the Armed Forces of the United States
- Must possess and maintain valid Florida Driver's License

Knowledge, Skills, Abilities & Other

Regular and prompt attendance is mandatory in the performance of an employee's duties for this position, to include scheduled work hours, and required training activities, calls for mandatory overtime needs and calls for service during times of an emergency.

Ability to utilize effective communication skills both verbally and in writing.

Knowledge of Florida Model Jail Standards and Sheriff's Office rules and regulations as applied to correctional work.

Knowledge of the application of modern correctional principles and practices.

Ability to demonstrate ethical and professional behavior; analyze and synthesize information or situations; solve

problems; recall facts and/or information; describe persons, things, and/or events; read and comprehend information; speak clearly; prepare written reports; print legibly; follow directions; detect smells; operate equipment; apply mathematical skills; read maps; operate radio equipment; attain and maintain weapons proficiency; maintain personal fitness; demonstrate firearms safety procedures; demonstrate service weapon firing; demonstrate shotgun firing; load ammunition into firearm: demonstrate chemical agent use; diagram a scene; take notes. Ability to drive a motor vehicle in a safe and efficient manner.

WORKING CONDITIONS

The work environment is mostly within the confined setting of the John E. Polk Correctional Facility, Seminole County Juvenile Facility or the Seminole County Court System. This position generally works a shift (days or nights) with rotating days off.

PHYSICAL ATTRIBUTES REQUIREMENTS

Mobility-Frequent standing for extended periods of time, walking for extended periods of time, stooping, bending, climbing stairs, may be required to drive an agency vehicle and/or transport inmates; constant use of a computer; use of a firearm

Lifting-Able to lift 50 pounds

Visual-Constant overall binocular vision; constant color perception, constant eyehand coordination; constant depth

perception; frequent reading/close-up work; constant field of vision/peripheral

Dexterity-Frequent repetitive motion and reaching

Hearing/Talking-Constant requirement to hear normal speech; constant hearing on telephone and radio; ability to hear faint sounds; constant talking on telephone/radio

Emotional/Psychological- Potential contact with hostile individuals; direct inmate contact, exposure to emergency situations; may be exposed to trauma, grief and death; frequent public contact; decision-making and concentration

Special Requirements-Ability to behave respectably and with utmost integrity even when off duty. Shift work (days or nights) with rotating days off including working weekends, nights, holidays, and/or overtime; May be required to respond for any critical incident, manmade or natural; must be able to appropriately wear and operate a self-contained breathing apparatus

Environmental-Occasional exposure to varied weather conditions
