

NEWS RELEASE SCSO seeks public's help identifying unknown man being treated at local hospital

SEMINOLE CO. (Nov. 20, 2016) – The Seminole County Sheriff's Office (SCSO) is seeking the public's help identifying an adult male who is currently being treated at a local hospital and is not able to provide his identity.

The man was admitted to a hospital in Orlando on Oct. 27th and was transported to a hospital in Seminole County on October 29th. Hospital staff contacted the SCSO on Thursday to report the man was in good condition; however, he has not been able to effectively communicate his name or any other personal information. All attempts to identify him have failed and there have been no reports of missing adults matching his description in Seminole County.

The black male is approximately 5'9" tall, weighs 203 pounds, and is believed to be in his mid 20's. He has brown eyes, black hair, and a beard. He has a small mole on the nose, a two-inch scare on his left knee, and a pieced left ear. He has no tattoos or other distinguishing marks on his body.
