SCSO arrests employee for Medicaid fraud, theft - 11/21/2012

SEMINOLE CO. (Nov. 21, 2012) - Investigators with the Seminole County Sheriff's Offi ce (SCSO) yesterday arrested Syberina Wynn. Wynn, a civilian child protection invest igator who worked off-duty as a counselor for Circle of Friends, a Medicaid provider, submitted false claims that resulted in reimbursement from the organization and Medic aid. Wynn also submitted false time sheets to SCSO and used Sheriff's Office propert y to submit the claims. Wynn was charged with scheme to defraud, grand theft, Medica id fraud, and cheating.

SCSO began investigating the incident on Aug. 17 after an agency supervisor noticed improper activity by Wynn. Wynn was immediately placed on administrative leave. Inv estigators found that from Jan. 1 – Aug. 14, Wynn billed Circle of Friends for counse ling she never provided. Wynn was expected to provide one hour of counseling one day a week for each client. Instead, Wynn typically saw multiple clients together in a o ne hour period, but billed for them separately. Wynn also saw clients on Sheriff's O ffice time and in her uniform, and collected compensation for the counseling while al so on the clock as a Sheriff's Office employee.

During the eight month period, Wynn received \$7,655 in payments from Circle of Friend s for counseling she conducted at the same time she was on duty. During the same per iod, she claimed and received \$6,753 in overtime from SCSO for her duties as a child protection investigator.

Wynn was booked in the John E. Polk Correctional Facility and her employment was term inated. Wynn has served as a child protection investigator with SCSO since she was h ired in April 2008.
