2017 Special Olympics Law Enforcement Torch Run

Seminole Co. Fla., (April 12, 2017) – Tomorrow morning, members of the Seminole County Sheriff's Office will participate in the 2017 Law Enforcement Torch Run to raise awareness for Special Olympics. The event starts at 9:00 a.m. at Maitland Blvd. and U.S. Highway 17/92. Participants will carry the torch north along 17/92 to Sanford and will complete the nearly 13-mile journey at the Sanford Police Department. Motorists utilizing this route should expect possible delays until 1:00 p.m.

The Law Enforcement Torch Run is the largest grass-roots event for Special Olympics. Law enforcement officers from around the country carry the Flame of Hope in honor of the Special Olympics athletes in their areas and around the world. Special Olympics is the world's largest sports organization for children and adults with intellectual disabilities, providing year-round training and competitions to more than 5.3 million athletes and Unified Sports partners in nearly 170 countries.
