National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day to take place tomorrow

~11 drop-off locations in Seminole County~

Seminole Co., Fla. (April 28, 2016) - Tomorrow, Seminole County residents will once again have the opportunity to safely dispose of old, expired or unwanted prescription medications. The Seminole County Sheriff's Office (SCSO), in conjunction with the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), Seminole Prevention Coalition, and other local law enforcement agencies will participate in the National Prescription Drug Take-Back event.

On April 29, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. prescription drugs may be turned in at the following 11 locations:

- Altamonte Springs Police Department- ASPD Mall COPS Center, lower level between JC Penney and Macy's, 451 E. Altamonte Dr., Altamonte Springs
- Casselberry Police Department – 4195 S. U.S. Highway 17-92, Casselberry
- Lake Mary Police Department – 165 E. Crystal Lake Ave., Lake Mary
- Longwood Police Department – 235 W. Church Ave., Longwood
- Oviedo Police Department – 400 Alexandria Blvd., Oviedo
- Sanford Police Department – 815 Historic Goldsboro Blvd., Sanford
- Winter Springs Police Department – 300 N. Moss Rd., Winter Springs
