Update on attempted homicide ~suspect arrested~

Seminole Co. – (Sept. 6, 2017) – Seminole County Sheriff's Investigators yesterday arrested Fredis Garcia-Lopez, 28, of Orlando, for the attempted homicide of Ali Moumnine, 31, of Chuluota. Upon a thorough investigation, it was determined that Garcia-Lopez was responsible for the crime. A warrant was subsequently issued for his arrest.

Yesterday at approximately 2 p.m., investigators located Garcia-Lopez at his residence located at 626 E. Magnolia Ave. in Longwood. He was taken into custody without incident and arrested on the charges of attempted homicide and aggravated battery. Garcia-Lopez was booked into the John E. Polk Correctional Facility (JEPCF) and remains incarcerated on a no bond status. He is scheduled to attend first appearance today at 1:30 p.m. at the JEPCF.

The victim remains hospitalized in critical but stable condition. It is still not known what events lead up to the shooting. This investigation remains active and ongoing.

SCSO investigates attempted homicide

Seminole Co. (Sept. 4, 2017) —The Seminole County Sheriff's Office Major Crimes Unit is currently investigating an attempted homicide that occurred overnight.

At approximately 12:35 a.m., deputies responded 2731 Pickett Downs Dr. in Chuluota, in reference to a report of a shooting with injuries. Upon arrival, they found a male victim who had been shot multiple times. The victim was conscious but was only able to provide deputies limited information on what occurred. He was transported to a local hospital in critical condition.

Investigators are working to identify the suspect who is still outstanding at this time. They believe the suspect and victim know each other and this was not a random act. It is not known at this time what events lead up to the shooting.
