## SCSO to hold annual memorial service tomorrow - 05/23/2012

The Seminole County Sheriff's Office (SCSO) invites members of the community and the media to join us for our Annual Law Enforcement Memorial Ceremony honoring SCSO deput ies who made the ultimate sacrifice.

The ceremony will take place at 10 a.m. tomorrow at the Seminole County Sheriff's Office, located at 100 Bush Blvd, in Sanford, Fla.

The ceremony will include remarks by Sheriff Don Eslinger and Congressman John Mica. Family members and descendants of each of the six fallen officers will participate in a rose ceremony at the memorial monument. The event will also include a 21-gun salut e and flyover.

Media attending should please enter on Bush Boulevard and make a right into the secon d parking entrance (on the West side).

SCSO has lost six deputies in the line of duty. In 1922, Deputy Cleveland Jacobs was shot while trying to arrest a man for theft. In 1975, Deputy Robert Moore died as he saved inmates from a fire in the jail. Two years later, Deputy George Pfeil was mort ally wounded when he interrupted an armed robbery at a pharmacy. Deputy Hugh Thomas lost his life in 1989 when he was shot responding to a prowler call. Deputy Eugene G regory made the ultimate sacrifice in 1998 after being assaulted by a mentally ill pe rson. In 2011, Deputy Matt Miller lost his life in a traffic accident when another v ehicle pulled in front of his motorcycle, fatally injuring him.
