## Amber, Ellie or Rosie? SCSO asks community to vote on Facebook to select bloodhound puppy's name - 07/02/2012

Will she be called "Amber," "Ellie" or "Rosie?" The community will decide the name o f the Seminole County Sheriff's Office (SCSO) new bloodhound puppy this week through an online vote. The public can now visit the SCSO Facebook page at (www.facebook.co m/seminolesheriff) and vote by "liking" their favorite of the three names. The name with the most "likes" at 5 p.m. on Friday, July 6th will officially become the winnin g name of SCSO's newest four-legged deputy.

The three names for the puppy were selected from 78 entries submitted by children at SCSO's Police Athletic League (PAL) camp. The finalists are:

• Amber - chosen because of her color and she will be used during Amber Alerts

• Ellie - chosen because it sounds like the letters "LE" which is short for la w enforcement; and

Rosie - chosen because she'll have the nickname "Nosey Rosie."

The winning name will be announced on Friday, July 13th at 10:30 a.m. at a ceremony a t PAL camp. The media will be invited to attend the ceremony and meet the children w ho submitted the three names.

The female puppy is 3-months-old and was donated to SCSO by The Jimmy Ryce Center. O nce she completes her 18-24 month training program, she will replace 5-year-old blood hound, Billee, who will retire and live at home with his handler. Like Billee, the n ew bloodhound will be used to track scent trails of missing children, seniors with Al zheimer's, and criminal suspects.
