## National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day to take place tomorrow - 09/28/2012

Tomorrow, Seminole County residents will once again have the opportunity to safely di spose of old, expired or unwanted prescription medications. The Seminole County Sher iff's Office (SCSO) is teaming up with the Drug Enforcement Administration, the Semin ole Prevention Coalition and area law enforcement to recognize National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day.

Tomorrow, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. prescription drugs may be turned in at the following 11 locations:

The service is free with no questions asked. Disposing of unwanted medications through approved drop-off locations helps eliminate the possibility of abuse, misuse and diversion.

This is the second national prescription drug disposal event held this year. At the April event, SCSO collected 168 pounds of prescription drugs from the community, and across the country, citizens turned in more than 552,161 pounds (276 tons) of unwante d or expired medications at more than 5,600 take-back sites in all 50 states and U.S. territories.
